The history of the Italian Cooperative Movement is strictly linked with the history of the Country.

■ Italian cooperatives enhance the potentialities of territories, without delocalizing, assuring the entrepreneurial plurality, employment, equal opportunities for women and youth, sustainable development, social cohesion, welfare, etc.



Italian cooperatives contribute to 8% of national GDP

7% of total employment

The Italian cooperatives are a reality capable of great social and economic inclusion since 58% of those employed are women, 15% are immigrants.

1 out of 5 Italians is a member of a cooperative

1 Italian out of 3 buys in a cooperative

1 Italian out of 8 yearly uses services provides by social welfare and health care cooperatives

Art. 45 of Italian Constitutional Chart

"The Italian Republic recognizes the social function of co-operation with a mutual and non profit character.

The legislation promotes and favours its development by the most suitable means and assures, through appropriate controls, its features and aims."
